

Muslim Aid provides shelter kits to flood affectees of Rajanpur

ISLAMABAD, March 2: Muslim Aid has provided shelter kits to the flood affected people of Rajanpur for construction of houses, said Khobaib A Wahedy here on Monday. The



distribution ceremony held in Rajanpur in which Sardar Dost Muhammad Khan Mazari (Parliamentary Secretary), Programme Manager Muslim Aid Rizwan Baig, Moeezudin and representatives of various other NGOs participated.

Muslim Aid Country Director said that Muslim Aid assessed the damages and losses caused by flash floods in Rajanpur in 2008 and there is a need to



work for the rehabilitation of the affected people as they are still helpless.

Muslim Aid Country Director said that the Muslim Aid was fully aware of the problems faced by the flood affectees and was trying to solve their emergency and long-term problems on priority basis so that they may be able to adopt normal life.



Speaking on the occasion, Sardar Dost Muhammad Khan Mazari Parliamentary Secretary said that

Mazari said that the floods have



caused massive damage with crumbling walls, causing a severe food shortage, with people forced to spend their lives under open skies.

In such a situation Muslim Aid provided relief goods to the flood affectees of Rajanpur district and the situation was being improved. He expressed his deep and heartfelt gratitude for the Muslim Aid, who initiated timely relief and long-term shelters supply for flood affectees of Rajanpur.



Later on shelter kits were distributed among 133 families who would be able to construct their houses. Participants of various other NGOs and INGOs addressed during the distribution ceremony of shelter kits.
